Congratulations! As you prepare to begin your first year at Harvard, take a minute to think about your long-term goals. Do you want to improve your leadership abilities? Are you interested in service to your Nation? **Did you know that Harvard has an Army ROTC program that offers full tuition scholarships to undergraduates?** Here are some highlights of the program:

- **As a freshman or sophomore, there is no commitment for trying Army ROTC.**
- ROTC only consists of **two to three hours a week** and doesn't meet during reading period or exams.
- **2, 3, or 4 year scholarships are available that cover full tuition and mandatory fees at Harvard.** In addition, you receive a monthly stipend of \$300 as a freshmen, and \$900 a year for books.
- **Leadership opportunities and internships are widely available:** Cadets recently interned at the Pentagon, Hawaii, and Japan. Furthermore, current cadets have gone to airborne school and learned to jump out of planes, worked in research labs in California, and spent time with a Special Forces team.

The leadership and management skills learned in ROTC and in the Army are second to none and highly sought-after in the private sector.
